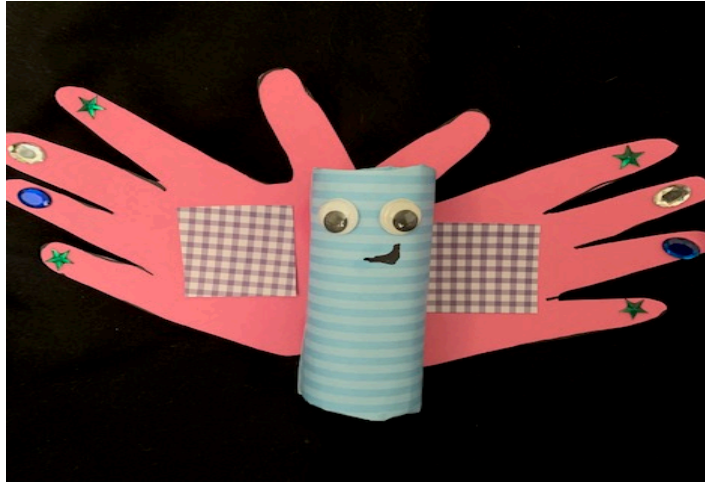


Craft Corner: Handprint Butterfly

Recommended books: Bugs! Bugs! Bugs! By Bob Barner
A Butterfly is Patient by Dianna Hutts Aston

Materials Needed:

- Toilet paper roll,
- Colored construction paper or white paper,
- Googly eyes,
- Pen or marker,
- Stickers/jewels,
- Glue,
- Tape,
- Scissors

Note: If you don't have color/pattern construction paper, googly eyes or jewels/stickers, simply use white paper and crayons/markers to decorate!

Directions:

- Cut 8.5 x 11 paper in half and wrap around toilet paper roll. Tuck in both ends and use tape to secure tightly.
- Trace child's hands on paper and then have them cut out handprints for wings. (Great opportunity to practice cutting!)
- Decorate wings with jewels, stickers, or design with crayons/markers. Each butterfly will look unique.
- Attach handprints to the back of the toilet paper roll with tape/glue. Make sure that the thumbs are on top for antennae!
- Glue googly eyes and draw mouth with marker.
